Dame Ann Ebsworth was a judge of the Queen's Bench Division from 1992 until 2001 and a circuit judge from 1983 to 1992. She had the great distinction of being the first woman appointed to be a judge of the Queen's Bench Division. Although she referred to herself as a 'safe pair of hands' she was much more than that. She cared deeply about the law, but even more deeply about justice.

Dame Ann devoted a great deal of her time to teaching advocacy. The South Eastern Circuit benefited greatly from her involvement over many years in the annual course at Keble College for young practitioners.

She died in 2002 of cancer when she was only 64. As the Guardian wrote shortly after her death, 'She leaves a lasting mark on the history of the legal world, and in the hearts of those fortunate enough to have known her well'.
